### **Statement of Scholarship**

***Denise Snow, JD, RN, CNM, NP, Clinical Associate Professor***

Education has transitioned in many areas such as content delivery and essential curricula elements. My professional and academic progression has transitioned accordingly. However, my values remain unchanged- scholarly excellence through innovative and interdisciplinary education.

Maintenance of clinical competence is essential to my contribution to education, not only to translate theory into students’ practice, but to serve as a competent clinician resource to students. My extensive experience as a practicing midwife (in my previous academic role within the Midwifery Program) lent expertise to the development and deployment of the midwifery curriculum, and allowed me to serve as preceptor and resource to many aspiring midwives. As I have transitioned professionally to the legal profession, that same level of clinical competence has given me the expertise to develop courses that focus on special populations, health care policy, social determinants of health, social justice and patient advocacy. As a community based clinician, I have the experience to serve as a resource in the Community/Population based health courses. Additionally, roles in the local, state and national arena, ensures scholarship as to leadership domains within the curricula.

Clinical competence as a legal advocate translates to effective classroom teaching of students to advocate for clients for seemingly intractable social/economic ills that affect health outcomes. Defining and discussing these health care problems leads to a more thorough understanding of health care law and policies and in turn, leads to a higher level of understanding of how to effectively advocate for clients. Recognition for contributions to reducing the stresses of social determinants of health and promotion of social justice in health care, enhances my credibility with students and is often reflected and commented upon in the students’ evaluation of my teaching. Solid clinical experience results in an ability to guide students to better advocate for both the profession and clients. Additionally, a focus toward achieving social justice, builds the platform upon which compassionate care is instilled in our students and provides the tools they need to lead as professionals and to influence policy.

Academic scholarship includes service to the School, the University and the profession. I serve as Co-Chair of the Admissions and Academic Standards Committee, a role that was especially important through the CCNE preparation process. I was invited to participate in the drafting of the University’s Middle States reaccreditation standard of Governance and Leadership. I serve as a reviewer for two peer reviewed nursing journals. I also serve as Co-Chair of the Health and Hospital Law Committee of the Suffolk County Bar which invites clinicians to educate the Bar on health issues. Through this role, I have appointed nursing, medical and social work colleagues, including a DNP student, to panels for interprofessional discussions. As to service to the nursing profession, I have an appointment to the statewide leadership committee- New York State Action Coalition- Nurses on Boards. I

have served on the Executive Board of the National Perinatal Association, comprised of neonatologists, perinatologists, obstetricians, and neonatal nurse practitioners.

Scholarship is reflected in the textbook chapters authored on prenatal care and policy in textbooks. On-going scholarship in the nursing field is reflected in my current publications such as a column I write on nutrition for a maternal/child nursing journal. In my role as legal advocate for those with health-related needs, I am frequently asked to lecture and collaborate with other disciplines within the Health Sciences. For example, based on my work, in collaboration with faculty of the School of Medicine a module of case studies, readings and assignments to promote advocacy of health care professionals has been added to both the medicals students' and the nursing students' coursework. I have presented at the national level with an interdisciplinary team which included a physician and social worker. Working with the Director of Palliative Care at Stony Brook University Hospital, I have co-authored peer reviewed journal articles exploring innovative approaches to address patients' social/financial suffering.

As a scholar, I have embraced innovation in nursing education. Just as "distance education" was novel when first offered, new concepts in classroom teaching and ever evolving technology have the potential to enhance the academic milieu. It is my goal to continue to transition and progress as an educator and scholar and to continue to mentor future leaders.
