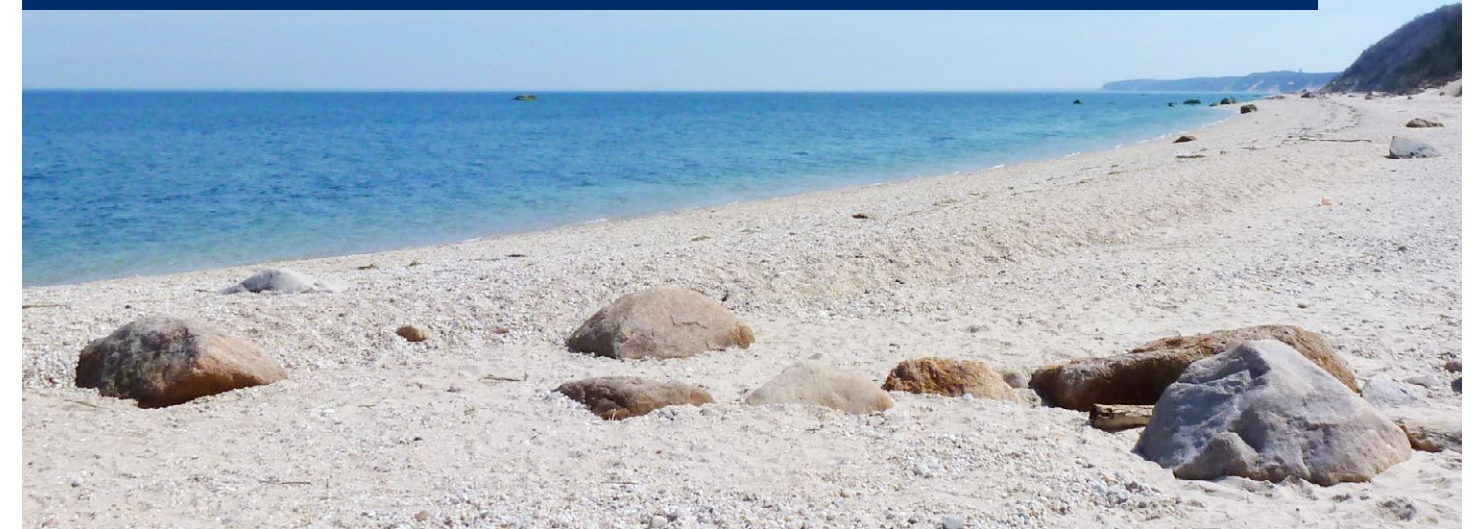

Planning for a Resilient Long Island

With hundreds of miles of coastal and estuarine shoreline, nearly 11 million people in the metropolitan region living just above sea level, numerous bays and estuaries designated as Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat Areas, and a mix of urban, suburban and agricultural communities—Long Island faces unique challenges from extreme weather, storm surges and rising sea levels, as well as other climate-variability related risks.

The conference will address the formidable impacts of climate variability and disruption on Long Island and discuss solutions and strategies municipalities can take to create more resilient communities. Conference presenters will include representatives from local and county governments, the New York Department of State and Department of Environmental Conservation, FEMA, and EPA, as well as scientists, planners and leading land use and municipal law scholars.
