ORIENTATION SCHEDULE

First Year Orientation covers four days, Sunday-Wednesday, August 15-18. On Sunday, August 15, 12:00 noon, all students (day and evening) participate in a welcome ceremony, followed by an alumni luncheon (1:00-2:00 p.m.) and small-group classes on professionalism and justice (2:15-3:15 p.m.). Also on Sunday, August 15, 3:30-5:00 p.m., as a way of emphasizing the school's public interest commitment, first-year students ("1LS") have the option of participating in a community service project (details below). Orientation classes are Monday-Tuesday, August 16-17 (10:00 a.m.-1:20 p.m. day students, 6:30-9:50 p.m. evening students). Tuesday's session includes an "Ask Anything" discussion with upper-level students. Orientation wraps up on Wednesday evening, August 18 (all first-year students, day and evening) with a BBQ/student organization fair (5:30-6:30 p.m.), a class on case synthesis (6:30-8:40 p.m.) and a plenary closing session (8:50-9:50 p.m.). SOME BUILDING TIPS

Smoking. Touro is a smoke-free environment. Smoking is prohibited anywhere inside the building and within 50 feet of the building. The only places on campus where smoking is permitted is in the designated area of the patio in the rear of the cafeteria and in the parking lots. Smoking is prohibited on the entrance plazas. Smokers please use the ashtrays provided in the smoking areas. Butts should not be discarded on the ground or in the ornamental planters.

Security. Everyone, students, faculty and staff, must show Touro ID on entering the building.
